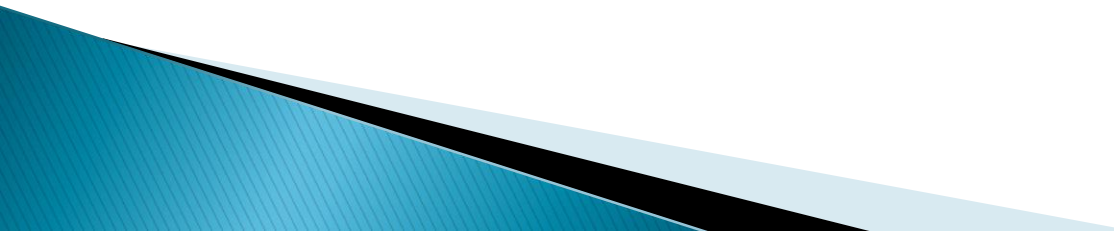

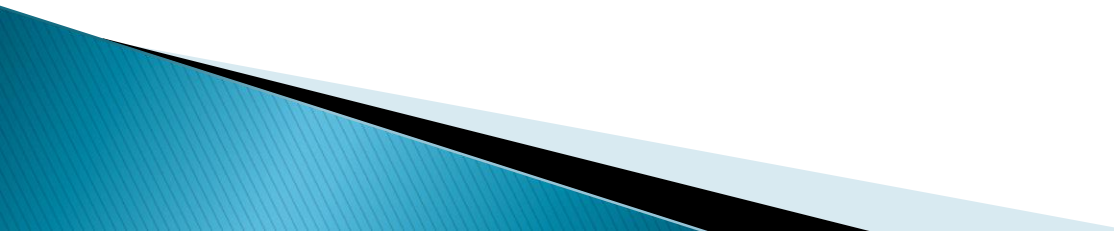
IB Mission Statement

 - ▶ Completing all of the requirements results in an additional international diploma.
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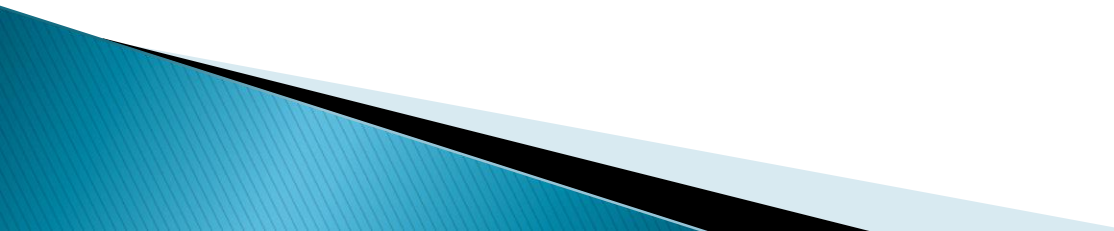
IB Diploma Requirements:



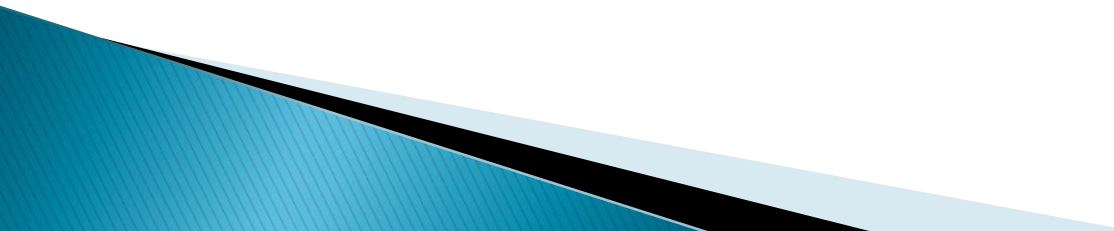
IB Diploma Program Rigor:

- ▶ 3 Higher Level Courses (generally 2 years of study)
 - ▶ 3 Standard Level Courses (generally 1 year of study plus prior experience, such as World Languages or Mathematics)
 - ▶ Theory of Knowledge Course (TOK)
 - ▶ Creativity Action and Service (CAS)
 - ▶ Extended Essay

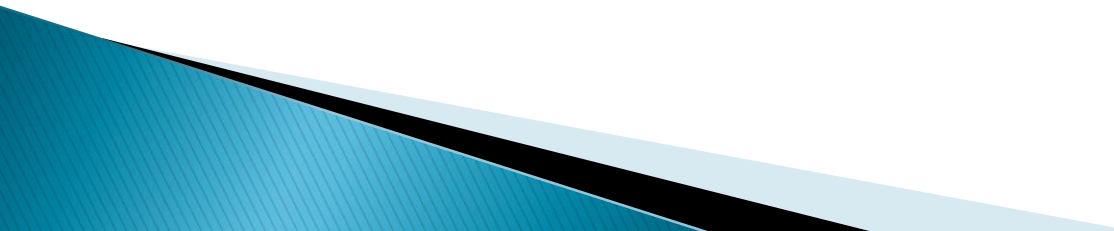

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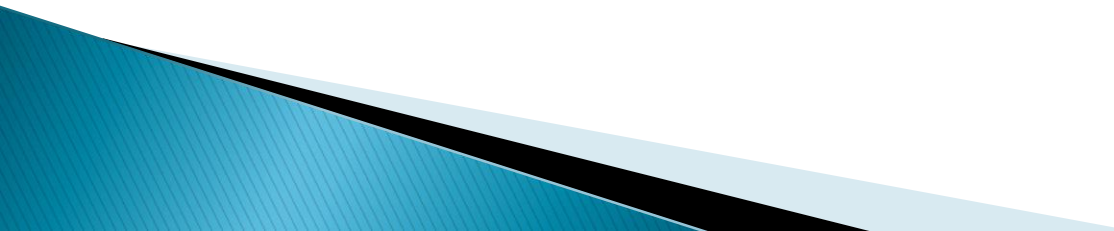
