Extended Learning Program Assessment Disclosure Statement

The ELP assessment battery consists of nationally normed standardized tests that are administered by examiners specifically trained in the assessment of pre-school and school-age children. The tests will be administered for the purpose of identifying advanced learners who meet the eligibility criteria for ELP services.

The ELP Department is confident in the assessment process and the validity of the results. The following procedures will apply:

1. The results of the ELP evaluation for my child will be kept confidential.
2. No evaluation reports or recommendations from private/outside agencies will be considered as part of the **student's eligibility for ELP**.
3. No student will be re-tested within one calendar year unless one of the circumstances outlined in paragraphs 4, 5, of 6 exist.
4. If after your child completes the testing, you have reason to believe that there are circumstances to suggest the testing results could be invalid, (i.e. illness, undisclosed family emergency situations, extreme anxiety by the child after the testing session), you must notify the ELP Department by phone (801-578-8573) or in writing within **2** business days from the date your child was tested.
5. At the discretion of the examiner, testing may be terminated during the testing session for the following reasons including, but not limited to: obvious illness, extreme noncooperation, and/or suspected previous exposure to the testing instrument(s). If the testing is terminated during the session, your child will be re-scheduled for a comparable assessment at a later date.
6. Alternatively, at the discretion of the examiner, the examiner may allow testing to be completed. **If after a review of the student's testing protocol by the ELP Department and/or scoring the test**, the ELP Department has reason to believe the testing results could be invalid for any reason, including those noted above (whether reported to you by the examiner or not), you will be notified by the ELP Department.
7. *The ELP Department will comply with FERPA in explaining student records to parents. However, in order to maintain the validity, reliability, and integrity of the assessments used, unless required by state law or court order, the ELP Department does not release actual assessment protocols and, in the lower grades, the name of the assessment used. Parents are welcome to contact the ELP **psychologist to discuss their student's assessment results.***
