1. Some of you are still giving us the (Stink) (EYE) and (Having a Power Struggle) with us. When your students are finished testing, PLEASE have them line up OUT IN THE HALL - Not in a line by the door or on the stage steps. We will watch your lovies while they are in the gym, and send them right out to you as soon as they are finished! The idea is to get the students out of the testing area as fast as we can. The more students in the testing area . . . even if you think they are being quiet... adds to the noise and confusion level. We don't know who has been tested and who is waiting to be tested. Some teachers start chatting with other teachers and then we end up with 4 or 5 classrooms in the area. We now are screaming in order to be heard by the students being tested. I know we are prima donnas, but work with us people!!! *Thank You So-o-o Much!*
2. Please practice with your students using the attached hand, before coming to the Vision Screening area. When they've gotten the basics down, then have them practice covering one eye, then the other eye and indicating the direction with the other hand.
3. Please don't send students down with library books, pencils, cards or other items in their hands; they will not be in line long enough to be reading. They have to set items down, pick them up, it wastes too much time; they need their hands to do the screening.
4. If they have name tags, please have them wear them to the eye screening. Name tags are so helpful!! DON'T MAKE THEM SPECIAL FOR THE SCREENING! Some of you have them for substitute teachers, etc. Magic Marker on clothes pins makes a fabulous name tag, as does masking tape. FIRST AND LAST NAMES. LAST NAMES ARE THE MOST IMPORTANT. Grade, Room Number and Teacher would be nice too. Would a grande, non-fat latte, one shot of espresso, with sugar-free cinnamon dolce syrup, no foam, excruciating hot be too much to ask?
4. If students have glasses, please have them wear their glasses to the screening. If they wear contacts, please have the students inform the screener.
5. Don't forget to mark your absences on the class lists on the table.
6. Special Ed Teachers: If your students are unable to do the Snellen Test after practicing, there is no need to bring them down to the testing area. Talk to Judi Jaworsky, Special Ed Nurse.
