OPEN ENROLLMENT INSTRUCTIONS AND GUIDELINES

For the coming school year, students interested in enrolling in a Salt Lake City school who live outside the district or school boundaries may apply for an out-of-resident transfer during the Early Enrollment (Open Window) period from December 1, 2011, until February 17, 2012. Applications are taken in the Student Services Department of the Salt Lake City School District Administration East Building, 440 East 100 South, Salt Lake City, Utah. Applications will not be accepted after 4 p.m. February 17, 2012.

Students may apply for enrollment in schools designated as “Open” to transfer. Selected schools and programs may be at capacity for the coming school year and not available as a choice for out-of-resident students. A list of available schools and programs or other information pertaining to the open enrollment policy may be obtained after November 30, 2011, from the Student Services office at the above address or by calling 801.578.8206.

Students currently enrolled in sixth grade must apply for transfer to the middle school of their choice and eighth-grade students must make application for their high school of choice during the Open Window. Because Glendale Middle School houses grades 6-8, students interested in choosing Glendale should apply during their fifth-grade year.

A \$5.00 processing fee will be charged at the time of application and may be waived for qualified applicants.

Parents and students will be notified in writing by March 31, 2012, of acceptance or rejection of the request for Open Window transfer to that school.

Out of resident students currently enrolled on a school choice transfer may remain enrolled in their school for the coming year unless their transfer is rejected for the coming school year.

Transfers may be rejected and enrollment discontinued in that school as a result of:

- lack of space in a program or school
- student’s unwillingness to comply with district/school rules and policies
- suspension/expulsion from school.

If the transfer of a currently enrolled student is being rejected for the coming year, parents will be notified in writing by March 15, 2012.

PRE-KINDERGARTEN PROGRAM

Welcome to the Salt Lake City School District Early Childhood Pre-K Program! Parents are their child's first and most influential teacher. Together, we will present the best learning opportunities for your child. This first school experience is an important time for discovery and exploration while developing independence and social awareness for the beginning of a successful school career.

Our program is a developmentally and culturally appropriate program specifically designed to meet the needs of four-year old children. We provide a child centered environment, safe materials, meaningful and engaging instruction, and the emotional support that will guide your child's learning in all areas of development: social/emotional, physical, cognitive, and language.

Salt Lake City School District's Pre-K program strives to build relationships that allow children to interact positively with others. Since every child is unique, our preschools are organized to allow children to initiate activities that grow from personal interests and intentions. During this school year, students will develop their large muscles or gross motor skills as well as fine motor skills, while using written language to understand the purpose of print. Materials, imagination, and creativity will be used to explore abstract ideas and emotions. This is the time of optimal language development and children will be using their spoken language for problem solving, communicating, and negotiating with peers and adults. Pre-K students come to school eager to learn, and will be provided with experiences that assist with a smooth transition to kindergarten.

Children need to be four years old before September 2, 2012, to be eligible to enroll in our pre-kindergarten program.
