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## THE POLICY

The Salt Lake City School District Board of Education complies with all state and federal mandates regarding the enrollment of students in district schools. The board supports school choice by providing various enrollment options for students which enable the district to accommodate a wide range of interests and learning styles.

The purpose of this policy is to articulate enrollment requirements for both resident and non-resident students, including transfer students, and homeless and/or unaccompanied youth.

The district will set forth its specific processes for implementing this board policy through the accompanying [administrative procedures](#).
