Is a parent or grandparent of your child American Indian?

If so, your child is a descendent and is eligible for services in the Title VI program in the Salt Lake City School District.

	Frequently Asked Questions	
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Q: What is Title VI?

The Title VI program works with parents, teachers, and counselors to offer help for American Indian children having a difficult time in school, or to provide American Indian cultural programs to enhance Indian children's cultural needs. Title VI networks with other programs to obtain counseling, tutoring, reading assistance, and sometimes financial assistance for American Indian Families.

Q: Why should I fill out this form?

Title VI receives all of its funding from each form that it filled out. The money goes only to help Native American children. Even if you do not apply for services for your child, you can help other Native American children by filling out the form and returning it to your child's school.

Q: What happens if I don't fill out the form?

Title VI loses the money that could have been used to help Native American children. So, even if your children do not need the services, why not help our other Native American families by filling out the form?

Q: Who has access to the information on the form?

This information is not shared with any government or Indian Agency. It is used only in our school district. No other government agency (including the BIA) has access to our files.

Q: If I fill out this form, will it affect any City, County, or State benefits I am currently receiving or have applied for?

No. The information on the form is used only by the Title VI in this school district and is not shared with any other local or State government agency.

Q: What if I do not know all the information requested on the form?

The only information required on the form is name of student, name of tribe/band, Membership Number or explanation for not having it, parent or guardian signature, child's birth date, and the date the form was signed. If child does not have an enrollment number, parent or grandparent's enrollment number can be written.

*If your child is a descendent of an American Indian Tribe, please complete the Federal Ed 506 form.

* If your child's parents or grandparents do not belong to an American Indian Tribe, do **not** fill out the form.
