THE POLICY

The Salt Lake City School District Board of Education recognizes the serious effect that concussions and head injuries can have on young, developing brains and therefore is committed to ensuring that the district responds to such injuries promptly and properly. While head injuries can occur in any setting, the district is committed to keeping students safe while they participate in school activities and programs, including district sporting events and physical education classes. In accordance with state law, the district will effectively and consistently manage any suspected concussions or traumatic head injuries and obtain written medical clearance before allowing a student who has sustained such an injury to return to activity.

The purpose of this policy is to appropriately identify and assist students who may have sustained a concussion or traumatic head injury.

The district has set forth its specific processes for implementing this board policy through the accompanying <u>administrative</u> <u>procedures</u>.

No district employee or student shall be subjected to discrimination in employment or any district program or activity on the basis of age, color, disability, gender, gender identity, genetic information, national origin, pregnancy, race, religion, sex, sexual orientation, or veteran status.
